

2. New Thrust Programme

Despite the initiative on extensive facilitation of Promotion of Sanghas and Self Help Groups by the 24 Diocesan Multipurpose Social Service Societies during the last 25 years, at the local level, the need of a broad state level approach was realized on Social, Cultural, Economic and Political stands was found to be missing.

Based on this the TASOSS, together with the Diocesan Social Service organizations has evolved a strategy with uniform policy, goal, plan, objectives and activities for the federation building project and it is being implemented.

Goal:

To enable people to form self-reliant and self sustaining federation at state level thereby leading to a people's movement.

Objectives:

To enable the federations to improve their capacities in

- Deciding, planning and managing their programmes and functions.
- Acquiring legal and social identity in order that they gain recognition among the societies.
- Establishing linkages with other peoples' organizations, government departments and resource centres.
- Mobilizing and administering resources for the development of the community.
- Developing and implementing functional communication, monitoring and documenting systems.
- Identifying macro issues, adopting proper strategies and implementing the same to tackle the issues.

And since 1999 the project activities have been designed and implemented with focus on the concepts such as Resource Analysis, Political clarity, Field Analysis, Problem analysis, Administrative Skill Development, Social Analysis, networking, conceptualization, support mobilization, resource mobilization and documentation.

Fruitful lobbying with Government Agencies:

Relentless efforts of the federation enabled the people of Veerasingampettai village to secure a Community Hall worth Rs.3 lakhs have borne fruit.

Arrangements have been made to get the Primary Health Centre at Thirukattupalli of Budalur Union, thanks to the lobbying of Federation.

Roads have been laid at Maharajapuram, Karuppur, Sangarampettai and Semmangudi villages due to the initiatives of the members of the SHGs of Federation.

Three street lights and 5 Community water taps, and 2 Electric Post for Karuppur of Papanasam Union have been secured.

Special Activities:

Eye Camp was organized in association with Regional Development Agency of Valangaiman.

Resources Mobilized:

Repairs worth Rs.60,000/- have been undertaken to 6 houses of Thelur village belonging to Ariyalur Union. Members of 3 Groups have secured an amount of Rs.1,16,000/- as loan from Indian Overseas Bank Ariyalur towards Income Generation Activities of rearing Milch Animals, Goatery etc.

Twenty five persons have procured Milch Animals with a total amount of Rs.2,50,000/- secured from KMSSS.

Fifty nine members have secured loans through internal lending to the tune of Rs.5,57,000/- for a variety of purposes of creating and renovating assets like houses and livelihood Resources of Procurement of Milch Animals, Goatery, Agriculture Development.

In Thirumanur Union, 7 persons have secured houses from Development office on Group houses scheme worth Rs.2,80,000/-.

In Valangaiman Union, 7 SHGs have secured a total Rs.4,90,000/- as loan to find Income Generation activities of Milch Animal rearing and Agricultural Development.

A total number of 505 persons have received Rs.21,22,200/- as loan from People's Bank and internal lending in the region of Thiruvaiyaru for Income Generation Initiatives. A Phenyl making unit is being run by the Punalvasal based group "Deepam".

An amount of Rs.1,80,000/- has been received from IOB Thiruvaiyaru by the members of Thirupalanam village.

The members of Karuppur and Vadasarukkai village groups have secured Rs.1,00,000/- as bank loan for various development purposes.




Sangamam (People's Bank)


The "Sangamam" (Peoples Bank) is the evolution of the Self Help Micro Finance Concept. The main objective of People's Bank is to ensure the people, sustainable financial self sufficiency by facilitating them to create resources on their own, through fostering the habit of savings among the members of groups/sanghas.

This "Sangamam" is a unit of the grassroots Self Help Micro Finance system which has culminated as federation. These village level micro finance institutions function as credit and thrift societies. They help the members through financing the collective and individual Income Generation Initiatives of the groups. The KMSSS facilitates the process of functioning and growth with 50% matching amount as assistace.

3. EMPOWERING FOR HUMAN DEVELOPMENT

Project area : Jayankondam, Ariyalur and Andimadam Blocks.

Project's Aim: Inculcation of 'savings habit' through formation of groups, facilitating

effective functioning and decision making for growth and development of socially economically deprived and politically

marginalized people in the area of operation.

Objectives:

 To form people's group and organize training and sensitize about nutrition, Health and organic farming.

- To promote economic and social development activities through savings...

To federate groups at union level and form people bank.

- To promote self help process, self respect and self confidence.

 To facilitate people participation in planning, implementation and evaluation of project activities.

Introduction:

After recruitment and training of the staff, the area, target people's needs were studied through PRA. The initial activity of formulation of village level sangams and specific problems oriented training programmes were conducted as a measure to sensitize the people on common issues and to analyze possible alternative course of solutions.

Activities carried out :

Training:

To streamline the field staff on expected activities and programmes they were taken to Kanchipuram on 27.10.2007 along with other development projects staff of KMSSS on observation visit. The "Makkal Mandram" members explained their method of operation in their area and how they tackle the issues. The Chief Co-ordinator organized a review meeting cum training on 07.10.2007 at Ariyalur in which the project staff took keen interest and participated. Social Analysis training was attended by the

Staff at Kumbakonam in which Mr. Victor Emmanuel as resource person gave ample exposure to the subject.

Activities:

a) Social Activities:

- In Thelur village sangam, 6 persons received Rs.10,000/- each and repaired their houses.
- Ariyalur and KK Nagar Sangam members submitted applications to the union Chairman and got contract of 1 KM road repairing and 150 meter cement road laying work, worth about Rs.2,15,000/-
- Meikavalputhur and Meensuriti sangams repaired 100 meter village road and conducted a seminar on healthful life.

KMSSS

- Through active participation of groups at Meikavalputhur, the main road breach was set right during the period of last year continuous rain.
- The bogus listing of houses damaged, during the last year heavy rain and partial attitude was brought to the notice of District authority by Pilichikuzhy village sangam and the village attendant was suspended.
- Demanding Bore well for Drinking water at Melaneduvai, 4 sangams jointly approached and got Bore Well.
- In Arulanadapuram village, 4 sangams gave application demanding Shed at the Bus Stop, public Distribution Shop (Ration), and mini Drinking water tank.
 They got Drinking water and other works are under process.
- Kuvathur village sangam represented their need of over head tank to the official. Tender is sanctioned for execution of this work.
- Ten members belong to Kandiyankuppam and Sengamedu villages planted tree seedings in their house premises.

b) Economic

- Five sangams received revolving fund loan of Rs.1,66,000/-. towards economic development.
- Paying a share of Rs.15,000/- each, the sengamedu and Keelaneduvai village sangams joined in union level "People's Bank"
- Meikavalputhur sangam bought 15 chairs and one petromax light and they earn through renting of these materials.

c) Political Participation

- In Ariyalur Union, the village sangam members participated and aired their grievances to the knowledge of the officials.
- All those who won the local Body election as peoples representative serve for the people's basic need in their own villages.
- Keelaneduvai village sangam by representing their need in the Grama Sabha, got sanctioned village Public Distribution Shop.
- In general 40% of people of Sanghas regularly attend the Gram Sabha Meetings.

d) Cultural:

The Awareness activities organized in villages has contributed a reduction of luxury expenses in celebrating family and community functions.

d) Special activities:

- On January 15th, Melakaruppur and Melaneduvai sangams celebrated Community Pongal.
- World women's Day was organized on March 15th, 2008 at Ariyalur in which Rally and Public Meeting was held and more than 500 women and Agri labourers representing the groups participated.

h) Networking Activities.

- Jointly with Jananayaka Madhar Sangam of Ariyalur and union level Sangam raised voice and filed FIR demanding justice against the injustice and violence caused to the young girl.
- Demanding basic need services to the target people, a rally was organized by Jananayaka Madhar Sangam and union level sangam at Ariyalur.
- Joseph Eye Hospital of Ariyalur with the support of sangams organized Eye
 Camp at Jayankondam and Andimadam on separate days in which more than
 300 persons were examined and referred for spectacles.

4. COMMUNITY BASED REHABILITATION

The intervention on Community Based Rehabilitation is being carried out since 2003 in the villages falling under the Jurisdiction *Thiruvidaimarudhur Block*. And KMSSS takes pride of being a pioneering organization in the entire erstwhile composite district of Thanjavur and in facilitating the Differently Abled Persons and other PWDs towards mobilizing them into CBOs on rights based activism and economic empowerment.

Target Area: Villages under 30 Panchayats of Thiruvidaimarudhur union.

Project Objectives:

- To conduct disability awareness and prevention initiatives.
- Strengthening the process initiative with the local self-help groups.
- To meet the rehabilitation needs of the disabled people, through community based rehabilitation approach.
- To promote a federation of the self-help groups towards self governance and sustainable action.
- To promote entrepreneurial skills and employment opportunity.
- Protecting the rights of the disabled persons through education and advocacy.
- Building the capacity of the staff to ensure better quality of the work.

Milestones crossed so far:

First Phase: The Project had the following 3 phases from January 2002 to June 2002

Collection of data on Persons with Disability was the major activity focus.


Second Phase: From January 2003 to December 2004

Awareness and Sensitization and training on the rights of PWDs, Skill development and rehabilitation measures through facilitation to organize them in to CBOs

Third Phase: From April 2005 to March 2007 strengthening of groups, Federation building, Legal awareness and Entrepreneurship development

Fourth Phase: Project period April 2007 to March 2009.

The staff members and the office bearers of groups of the Differently Abled Persons paid exposure visit to the organization IRCDS based at Thiruvallur. Its working area villages were visited. The staff and the members of the groups shared the field experiences.

Seven members received a total amount of Rs.70,000/- as loan for Income Generation activities of rearing Milch animals, Fuel wood depot and Petty shop, This apart internal lending to the tune of Rs.73,500/- have been received by the members for various purposes.

Special Activities:

Celebration of Disabled Day:

The Disabled day was celebrated on 05.12.2007 at Kumbakonam, a rally was taken out from the new bus stand to the KMSSS campus where a meeting was held. The district rehabilitation officer Mr. Thangavel and the Diocesan Administrator Rt. Rev. Msgr. Peter Francis graced the function with their special addresses. The members of the federation members made all arrangements for the function with the funds collected on their own.

"Samathuva Pongal" was organized on 10.01.2008 in villages, the harvest festival of Pongal was celebrated as a feast of communal harmony and equality. The function marking the same was held at Semmangudi village. The groups of Nagambodi, Semmangudi, and Vanduvanjeri together with the federation jointly organized the function and the Asst. Secretary Fr. S. Alphonse graced the function and appreciated the field staff.

Inauguration of Grocery shop:


A function marking the inauguration of the Grocery shop owned by the federation of Thiruvidaimarudur was held on 21.02.2008 and an amount of Rs.60,000/- has been made from this income generation initiative.

Day Care Centre Anniversary: - Thirucherai

The First Anniversary of the Day Care Centre together with the Republic Day was celebrated on 26.01.2008 similarly the Manager of Chalice Project of CANADA paid a visit to the centre on 10.02.2008 and he promised to adopt the children belonging to the center through the Sponsorship.

Network Activities:

Participation of our delegates in the meeting of State level Federation and ADD India added both knowledge on practical problems and realities.



Issue Based Activities:

Lobbying and Advocacy:

The discriminative act of the crew of government owned public transport buses, not stopping the buses at the recognized bus stop despite the requests of person with orthopedic disability, was taken up by the federation with the concerned authorities. And they have succeeded in establishing their rights.

Appointment of physician:

The federation has lobbied with the district authorities to ensure appointment of a physician at Kumbakonam for the purpose of issuing identity cards for the PWD, this has eased the trouble of having to travel all the way to the district headquarters for the persons with disabilities. This is the long pending demand of the community of PWDs belonging to the project villages.

5. Cow Project

Funding Partner : Missioners Seculares De Jesus Cletcetxe

Reporting Period: 01.04.2007 to 31st March 2008

Introduction :

For Empowering the Dalit (SC / ST) Christians through improving their standard of wing, they have been assisted with loans for procuring with Milch Animals, Goats and Fowls. This project was introduced and functioning well for the past 4 years with the generous Assistance of the Missioneres, Mr.Eduardo Traver Nicolau Y Nieves of Spain.

Objectives:

To assist the poor Dalit Community clients by giving a preference to widow, deserted and below the poverty status families.


Target People are:

- a) Dalit Community with poor social Status.
- b) Widows.
- c) Separated / Deserted / Divorced.
- d) Economically very backward family.

Operational Process:

Selection of deserving beneficiaries is made at the Diocese level by a committee of SC /ST Commission representatives, local parish priest and the KMSSS field staff. All the 6 vicariates of the Diocese area villages which are under the service area of KMSSS were covered before finalizing the list of beneficiaries to make them avail the assistance. Regularly repaying clients are eligible for 40% subsidy. This method of operation facilitates to extend the Assistance of cow project to new clients on a continuum.

During the current period of reporting, 50 persons were given the Milch Animals assistance and through which the beneficiaries' family members as well as the individuals are benefited. Children and senior people of the beneficiaries' family have the benefit of taking milk every day after supply to the Depot which enhances their health condition and development in addition to their income. The details of the beneficiaries are furnished below.



6. INSURANCE CARE FOR THE POOR (JANASHREE BIMA YOJANA)

Insurance:

As part of our continuing and varied interventions to mitigate the risks being faced by the families of the people belonging to Below Poverty Line, they are facilitated to join the schemes designed to cover the risks of loss of life and compensation for expenses on education of children. Under the "JANASHREE BIMA YOJANA" group insurance policy a good number of beneficiaries have been benefited as the annual premium is fixed at low amount of Rs.100/-.

Benefits and death claims:

In addition, if 100 persons join as policy holders, for 15 children's educational assistance of Rs. 1200/- each is provided.

For natural death a sum of Rs. 30,000/- is paid to the legal heir of the deceased. For accident death Rs. 75,000/- is paid and for any part of body loss Rs. 50,000/- is given. For partial damage and loss of movement Rs. 25,000/- provided by the L.I.C.

7. Sustainable Agriculture among Dry Land Farmers

Title : "Facilitation of Sustainable Agriculture among Dry Land

Farmers in 30 village Panchayats - Andimadam Block".

Operational Area: 30 village Panchayats in Andimadam Block.

Project Period: 3 years from November 2006.

Aims:

Project aims to enhance stable and adequate production levels through natural resources and sustainable means, monitoring and managerial skills, to learn techniques of water irrigation, recycling of farm nutrients and flow of organic matter to find more productivity and profit.

Objectives:

- → To enable 600 farmers, to achieve profit in dry land farming through sustainable agricultural practices.
- → To facilitate trainings and follow up on sustainable agriculture through Model Farm of the KMSSS.
- → To enable thousands of other small farmers to adopt the sustainable agriculture and environmental enhancement.
- → To formulate village level farmers club and train in appropriate techniques of cultivation.

Introduction:

The project area is one of the Most Backward regions in Tamil Nadu. Factors of nature deprivation such as low average rainfall, hard soil of semi rocky condition apart from excessive use of chemical fertilizers and pesticides have been seriously affecting they farmers. Added to these, unemployment condition worsened the situation. Small farmers were helpless except to dispose their tiny landholdings for their living and have been force to become landless labourers. Analyzing this problem and its severity the KMSSS initiated the project in Andimadam area.

Implementation of the Project:

In consultation with the local leaders, Parishioners and Vicariate Father, after a clear analysis of the problem, the plan of action for the project was drawn. For the purpose of easy and manageable reach, the target population located in 30 Panchayat areas were divided into convenient groups.



Goal:

To find change in socio-economic status of the rural poor women in the entire State of Nadu and to enhance the Self Help process and empowerment through Self Help Groups.

Objectives :

- 1. The objectives delineate the development of Groups Awareness, Savings, Micro-Credit (inter-lending), women leadership building and economic sustainability through Government and Bank Loans.
- Fostering Self Help process, solidarity in decision making, social reforms, health and family welfare, and removal of women oppression.
- Empowering women in skills of financial management, self confidence, networking, income generation, assets creation, and federation formation.

In a by election conducted in the Mallapuram panchayat, a member of our group has been elected as the ward member in the local Panchayat with active participation of SHG members of the area.

Socio-cultural activities :

As part of displaying Communal harmony, Community Pongal Feasts were organized, transcending caste and religious differences at the villages of Puthagaram, Thiruvidaimarudur, Thiruppanandal, Aduthurai and Sooriyanarkoil.

Special Activities:

- At Korkaipuducherry, on 9th May 2007, the grocery shop owned by the SHG "Esai Thenral" was inaugurated in which all the members and village people participated.
- 2) Awareness generation programme on women's health was organized on 01.07.2007 at Kumbakonam in which Mr. G.T.Rajan the Personnel Manager of KMSSS and Mr. Prabakaran of 'DIET' Aduthural addressed the women gathering and clarified many personal questions raised by the participants.
- Health awareness seminar was conducted to women at Sathankudi on the 25th of August 2007, involving the local Health Department staff.

Field Exposure Visits:

As part of Field Exposure, the staff of Mahalir Thittam visited "Makkal Manram" an NGO, based at Kanchipuram which has been in the forefront in fighting for the rights and the issues of the people in its working areas. It was an useful exposure visit to the staff members to know the Human Rights based activism.

Problem Salvation:

Local people of Thandanthootam raised an issue regarding change of Union Elementary School, and it has created unrest among villagers. The KMSSS field staff with the support of Tahsildhar, B.D.O. and Police Department Officials settled the problem amicably involving village Nattamais and SHG members in the dialogue.

10. SPONSORSHIP

Mission:

With the support of the community initiatives in developing educational and growth of the children through the sponsorship programme.

moibing, Moral, Social and Religious values :

- To affirm the sacredness of life and dignity of all the people, especially the children and parents.
- To make our children fully capable of identifying and addressing social conditions.
- To manifest or to shower the loving care of Christ for the poor and the suffering that is an essential element of Jesus teachings.

Goal:

"To alleviate the effects of poverty by offering an effective and trustworthy sponsorship Programme that reflects God's Love and Mercy".

KMSSS - Tamil Project has kept a few reliable objectives in the sponsor programme that is to promote equal opportunities to all children especially the most processor and child labor.

- To provide basic education, nutrition, clothing and healthcare.
- o To build up solidarity among the children.
- o To foster personality developments.
- To promote social awareness, health and hygiene to the parents.

Visit to the Sponsored Families:

Field workers of the Tamil Project visited the families of the sponsored children every month and encouraged them to work hard to lead a better life in the society. Occasionally Programme director and coordinator visited the children and parents and interacted with them regarding their needs and to know their expectations in studies etc..

Academic Status of the Children

This year result states that 70% of the sponsored children have passed their Government board exams with first class and 20% with distinction and other 10% have scored 2nd class, 3rd class and below.

Maximum Benefits

In the month of July, as part of fulfilling children's needs, they have been distributed school bag, geometry box, scale, pencil, sketch box, color pencil box, uniform, school fee, special fee, note books and mess fee. Mess fee is paid to the hostels every month through the field workers or through wardens, children were given rice, groceries, table, chair, hot case, table fan, tea buoy, cot, goat, bureau, electrical things, sewing machine, mixie, grinder, cooker, and inner garments and shoes to all the sponsored children.

Special Coaching

To improve the academic performance and General Knowledge, tuition teachers were appointed in all the sub sites to teach the sponsored children besides going to school. These teachers give special care to the children who are very poor in studies.

Medical Camp

To keep the children healthy and energetic, medical check up were conducted in which Blood, Urine and Motion tests, X-ray, ECG, Scan were done and remedial treatments to the children were given.

Visit of International Manager

In the month of February 2008 **Deacon Eugene Perabo**, the International Manager for Asia visited the Tamil Project with the **Regional Director Rev. Fr. Jaimy**. We were fortunate to celebrate the Birth Day of our Dear brother Deacon in Our Mother land India especially in our Tamil Project. He did taught the Logic Model Plan for 34 members in which the Director, staff, advisory committee members and the parents of the sponsored children took part.

Visit of our Regional Director

Every quarter, the Regional Director Rev. Fr. Jaimy visits the Tamil Project and gives us the direction for the better performance of the Tamil Project. He visited all the sub sites and talked to the sponsored children and their parents regarding the benefits they received and enquired about their growth.

Advisory Committee Meeting

Advisory committee meeting were conducted three times during the last year to plan for the better growth of the sponsored children, physically and spiritually. In which committee discussed the most urgent needs of the children and their families.

Christmas Greetings to Sponsors

Sponsored children sent the Christmas Greeting cards to the Sponsors. In that they had beautifully pictured their thankfulness that they wanted to show towards their foster parents.

Literacy Training to Parents

We have just started the Adult education to make the sponsored children parents to realize their duty as a citizen of the country and parent of the child. Our first aim is that, that no parent should keep thump impression and all should be able to put their own signature. We are slowly progressing.

Parents' Seminar



SSS established a Computer Centre at the Campus of the Little Flower Higher Secondary School Kumbakonam in the year 2006, with a scope to facilitate technical competencies among school and out of School youth of the nearby villages. Suitable emerging needs and current trends the computer programmes are designed. In addition to the youth, the local area institutions and Government Departments also sepute their employees to orient them about computer utilization and basic skills. In this regard a proper networking relationship is established with Government and Non Severnment organizations by facilitating their man power in computer skills.

A nominal fee is collected with an intention to ensure continuity of participation and to maintain the infrastructure required for the centre.

Thus the Computer Unit is delivering basic computer knowledge and skills through trained and competent staff. In summer days, students throng for getting trained than in other seasons of the year.

13. "HELLO" PEOPLE'S PROJECT

Introduction:

With the aim of ensuring job opportunities and to supply quality items of Groceries the target people of below poverty line, especially the Self Help Groups and secondary group of KMSSS project beneficiaries and the staff, this programme was initiated by the Secretary and blessed by the Most. Rev. Bishop in the year 2006.

Objectives:

- To provide employment to SHG Members in the project.
- To serve the families with Grocery requirements at fair price cost.
- To find avenues of self earning and employment of SHGs.
- To avoid middleman exploitation through direct purchase of Groceries.

Method of Implementation:

The groceries required to the target population such as Grains, Dhals, Coriander (Dhaniya), Chilly, Sesame oil, and Pepper, spice, cereals, turmeric, custard, pulses and raw materials for incense sticks, powder preparation were purchased in the whole sale market or from the producer and dried up for long period for durability and processed before packing. To meet the readymade use of groceries, few items are made in powder form and proper mixing and packing are also done according to different measures.

The SHG members and their families are participating in preparation of incense sticks. incense powders, phenol and other household materials and cosmetic items. Sponsorship beneficiary children's family also benefited by these Hello Project materials. Disabled youth were given training in I.G.P activities to make them stand on their own income through engaging in "Hello" project.

Asafetida preparation, instant mixes of Sambar powder, Rasa powder and Masala powder are moving fastly and there is more demand from the consumers.

Networking:

During Women's Day celebration held at "Sarva Mangala Hall, Kumbakonam" the Hello Project products were displayed and sold. Grocery shops run by the Disabled Federation members are receiving Hello Project items for sale in their own villages outlet. Seven persons of SHG members who are residing in and around Kumbakonam are given employment under this project.

14. MSW Students Field Placement

Mala Matha College, Vallam:

During the current year Mr. V. Kasi, II year MSW second began their internship at KMSSS on 4th December 2007 and he has visited the second work in every alternate days of the week (Tuesday, Thursday & Saturday) second from 4th December to 07.02.2008 to gain knowledge and experience in the second programmes.

Personnel Manager of KMSSS, rendered theoretical orientation support and the field programme Coordinator (SHG) extended guidance in the field. Through this field work arrangement the MSW student gained practical experience on Community Development, Leadership, Extension activities, Educational approach, organization of people, program planning etc.

Josephine and Miss Ramu from Bon Secours College for somen, Thanjavur were deputed by the Principal to KMSSS to undergo field experiences as part of academic persuit during the period of February and March 2008. They were given the responsibility of Area study, Data collection, need assessment and Educational programme organization. Accordingly, Srineevasanallur and Thiruvidaimarudur area were selected and they conducted meetings, individual contacts, interviews and resource mobilization for their action programmes.

After completion of their assignment they prepared field reports for submission to the institution (College).



15. Participation of KMSSS Staff in SC/ST Commission Meeting and Tour Programme.

The KMSSS Director to boost the morale and enhance the committed work of the staff, organized this programme to visit Delhi and participate in SC/ST Commission Meeting on 29th November, 2007. The Director and the Staff participated in the Dharna which was organized as a Macro Level protest by the All India SC/ST Commission in Jandar Mandar Road, New Delhi. National political leaders addressed the gathering about the importance of providing the benefits to SC/ST and to claim the quota in education as well as employment opportunities. Regional and State Level Representatives and Bishops, Fathers, Sisters and Lay people took a leading role in organizing and the conduct of the programme with more enthusiasm and vitality.

The previous day and next day of this programme, the KMSSS staff team visited the famous historical places of the past civilization like Taj Mahal, Agra, Jandar Mandar, Qudub Minar, Lotus Temple, Laxminarayanan Temple, India Gate, Red Fort, Chandni Chauk, Raj Ghat, Gandhi Museum and Indira Gandhi Museum which was an inspiring experience which gave lot of insight to know about the past history and the growth and glory of the Nation.

Lasa Assistance for SHGs Income Generation

The meeting held on 7th March 2008, following the survey, the local president and parents of affected children requested to take up programme to reduce their children problem. The KMSSS, under CBR project assured to ensure service programme for affected children in due course.

World Women's Day Celebration at Ariyalur

women's Day Programme was organized, at Ariyalur on 15th March 2008, in which women of Federation went on procession from New Bus Stand to Church campus. Rev. Fr. R.S. Antonysamy, parish priest of Ariyalur presided over the women's day meeting. Dignitaries Municipal Chairman Srimathi. S.Vijayalakshmi and District Revenue Officer Thiru. K.Pulamadan raised their voice in favour of women's rights. Professor Vasanthi, Arts College, Ariyalur, Thirumathi. Christy Subathra, Editor "Suttum Vizhi Sudar" and also News Branch - All India Radio, Trichy gave their special address to the large gathering of women. With vote of thanks the programme ended successfully.

Adoption of New Villages

KMSSS adopted very backward and poor, Scheduled Caste people residential villages of Sooriyanarkoil, Elumanthidal and Ariyapadaiveedu for the purpose of implementation of developmental and income generation activities. The KMSSS presented 30 children with new dress during the Deepavali Festival. Pongal Vizha was conducted in all the above villages purely with a collective response of local people and the Chief Coordinator and Staff of the KMSSS. Though the Government is extending number of welfare and developmental schemes, the above cited villages are deprived even the basic requirement of drinking water, house, electricity and approach road. The KMSSS Staff brought these to the notice of the "Mahalir Thittam" Officials and as a positive response the Sooriyanarkoil people have got cement road and others also expecting similar response.
