The KMSSS works in 391 villages, with 1544 SHGs and 13 union federations and in 3 district level. In addition to earlier approach of people building tasks of solidarity, identity and awareness, now emphasis is laid on sustainable development, rights based activities, empowerment of leadership and empowerment process and follow-up which emphasize the poor and marginalized towards enlightenment and demanding their needs and rights to the right person and right time.

We propose to give priority to sustainable and rights based programmes which requires mass approach in future.

Vision, Mission & Objectives

Vision

Strive for blossoming of Human values and rights where people of different faiths live together in peace, love, brotherhood, equality, respect and dignity.

Mission

Enhance the capabilities of the marginalized and their organization, influence public policies and exercise negotiating power, inculcate positive values of social order, develop sustainable livelihood programmes and promote economical standard through federating people's organization and net working and coordination, set up rehabilitation of disabled community, motivate conservation of ecology and environment and improve access to natural resources and technologies.

Objectives

The KMSSS is a Non-Government, Multipurpose Social Service Organization under the Diocese of Kumbakonam and has been registered in 1973, according to the Tamil Nadu Societies Registration Act XXI of 1860. The objectives of this organization are:-

- a) To perform works of charity for those in need irrespective of caste, race, community or creed.
- b) To engage in Social Service Activities aimed at improving the living conditions and general welfare of the poor, particularly of farmers and other working people, as well as poor and indigent persons of whatever occupations irrespective of race, caste, community or creed.

1.0 WHOLISTIC AND ECONOMIC PROGRESS

1.1 SPED – III

(Sustainability through Participation, Empowerment and Decentralization)

Reporting Period : April 2011 - March 2012.

Project Period : April 2011 to March 2016.

Target Area : Selected 20 villages of Thiruvudaimarudur Union.

Project Objectives : To enhance People's Participation, and empower them in a decentralized way and establish sustainability.

Focus:

- Economic Progress
- Food Security.
- Education.
- Welfare and Health
- Gender Equality
- Safe Environment

Activities:

- Families identified In 20 villages at the rate of 300 each.
- Target people were briefed about the project.
- Village Action Team (VAT) of 15 members were formed in each village and they are trained.
- At the organizational level, Community Facilitation Team (CFT) is established, with one representative from each village, Project staff and the Director.
- In all the villages, the PRA method of data collection was followed.
- After analyzing the data with involvement of people, problems were prioritized and further details collected on Health and hygiene.
- Seeds were distributed for kitchen garden to 50 families totally in each village.
- Twenty three children groups were established in 20 villages.
- Health Committees were formed in 20 villages.

- **Cultural programme:** conducted on the theme of 'Health and Welfare', with the support of "Vaigarai Disabled Persons Team", during the months of January, February and March 2012, and 5350 persons attended in 20 villages.
- **Medical Camp:**
With active involvement of the "Sacred Heart Hospital" staff of Sakkottai, Holy Angels Dispensary, St. Anne's Hospital and Vaishnavi Laboratory medical camps were conducted, in which 2668 persons belonging to 17 villages benefitted.

1.2 KMSSS-IOB Joint Venture Loan Scheme

Exclusively for promoting the economic, social and cultural dimensions and bring changes in the fundamental life styles of poverty stricken people, in the year 1978 the KMSSS-IOB Joint Venture economic loan was initiated. The target people engaged themselves in productive field of growth and find development. The IOB of Kumbakonam in association with KMSSS extends loan at low interest rate.

The milch animals were purchased and reared by the beneficiary target people through this loan assistance. The animals are insured and premium paid regularly to avoid risk factors.

1.3 Kolping India Project

Objectives:

- To ensure brotherhood, equality, integrity and justice among the target population.
- To improve the economic status and savings among the lower middle class and poor category of people.
- To develop self-confidence and self-help through awareness and training.

Area of operation:

Kumbakonam, South Michaelpatti and Jayamkondam Vicariates of the KMSSS field area.

Groups and Federations formed and functioning:

- Men groups 3, Women groups 25 = 28

- Members men 24 Members women 435: = 459
- Kumbakonam and Jayamkondam area federation formed.

II. Activities:

- With the intension of inter religious coherence, and economic development, Kolping groups were established.
- As part of joint action towards economic growth, the Susaiapparpattinam 'Valanar group' received Rs.2,00,000/- from Kolping India and benefited sturdily through proper system of functioning.
- Susaiapparpattinam group (St.Valanar) benefited through Collective Income Generation Programme loan and with this fund, the Church Tamarind grove was taken on lease basis and gained an income of Rs.12,000/-.
- Under the banner of "Kolping Sangamam", 19 groups formed "People's Bank" and finance is being revolved at low rate of interest among themselves.
- Federation Meeting is being regularly held once in 3 months.
- Four persons won in the local Body election as Ward Members through the group support.
- "Kolping Day" was conducted in a grand manner on 30.11.2011 with Mass and Cultural programmes in Kumbakonam. More than 250 members participated. Vicar General blessed the gathering with his inspiring talk. For distribution to the Aged Members Dhotis, Sarees, Towels were given by the Kolping Group members. Towards common fund special Kanikkai was given. At the end of the programme 5000 tree seedlings were distributed to the Kolping group members and the public.
- Kolping Saint's Photo was presented to the members of Kolping groups.
- Under Kolping project a common fund of Rs.6000/- was created.
- With the generosity of the Donor a sum of Rs.2,00,000/- was obtained as Flood Relief Fund. Sixty six persons of KMSSS area group members received Rs.1,14,500/, and 41 persons of Perambalur Social Service Society area group members received Rs.85,500/- relief fund.
- On 16.07.2011, Miss. Claudia, IKS representative from Germany, and National Director visited the project area and assessed the St. Valanar Kolping group of Susaiapparpattinam. They appreciated the growth and development of the group functioning and encouraged the group members.
- Samathuva Pongal Vizha was celebrated in Ammanpet and Vilangudi villages.
- Punalvasal Annai Theresa group, one day during Jabamalaimadha month gave Annadhanam to the people.
- Two separated families have united by the efforts of Chinnappar Kolping Group.

- Four members of Malai Madha group of Madhapuram got Government Houses.
- Koovathur 'Arokiya Annai' group received Rs.6,00,000/- loan from the Indian Bank Andimadam for development.
- To meet the Medical expense of Mrs. Mariya Arokiyam of Susaiapparpattinam group, National Office donated Rs.5000/- to her.

1.4 People's Bank - Sangamam

With the aim of developing Self Help, self confidence and self discipline in handling and managing their financial needs among the members of groups and federations the “Sangamam” was initiated by the Groups and the KMSSS played guiding role for encouraging savings and sustainable method of interlending at the village level Credit Society, and Union Level Sangamam (People's Bank). In this system the individuals and groups engage in developmental activities and benefited with low interest rate of 12% for loan, which resulted in freeing themselves psychologically and from the clutches of private money lenders. This scheme results in economic sustainability and development of the target population.

In addition to the group's savings, the KMSSS facilitate the group with incentives. The details of Sangamam activity at the Panchayat Union Level are furnished below:

2.0 COMMUNITY HEALTH AND DEVELOPMENT

2.1 Vazhikattum Thittam

Reporting Period: February 2011 to March 2012.

The Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu has introduced this programme on October 2010, based on the felt realities of the target population, specifically the Disabled/Differently abled Persons.

Aim:

To make the Disabled avail themselves of the Government Welfare Programmes benefit and improve their social status, rights and equality in the society.

Objectives:

- Formation of disabled persons group.
- Organic training to the disabled.
- Establish networking relationship.
- Avail benefits of Government declared welfare schemes.

Area of Operation locality:

(A) Jayamkondam Union of Ariyalur District.

(B) Thiruvidadimarudur Union of Thanjavur District.

Programmes and Achievements:

- In Jayamkondam Union, Elaiyaperumanallur, Kangaikondachozhapuram and Uthirakudy villages, 3 groups were formed with 26 members.
- In 35 Panchayats area, welfare workers were appointed.
- On 12, 13 & 14 of August 2011, training programmes were conducted by the Government Disability Rehabilitation Department to the field staff and the Coordinator of Vazhikattum Thittam.
- 186 applications were submitted to the District Collector demanding maintenance allowance.
- 36 Disabled persons were sanctioned monthly allowance of Rs.1000/- for each person.
- Disability survey was conducted in 35 Panchayats and 1173 disabled persons were identified.
- For 1143 disabled persons, on January 5th & 6th 2012, materials such as blankets, towels, soap etc were distributed with good will service of donor agency Chalice.
- In Jayamkondam Union special camp was conducted for the Disabled persons and the District Collector Presided over the function, and 361 persons received I.D. Card.
- Six persons belong to four villages gave their application in favour of assistance for small business with subsidy facilities.

Thiruvidaimarudur Union:

This scheme is being implemented in Thiruvidaimarudur Union from February 2011, with one Coordinator and 64 field workers. Disabled persons Survey was conducted, through which 1924 persons (1142 men & 782 women) were identified.

Government Welfare Schemes and the mode of approach to be followed to receive benefits were highlighted through awareness activities.

2.2 Community Based Rehabilitation Programme – CBR

Though the project assistance from Funding Partner has completed, the KMSSS continues the project activities because of the enthusiasm shown by the CBR Federation of the disabled.

Project Location: Thiruvidaimarudur Union.

Objective:

- Creation of Awareness.
- Leadership qualities formation.
- Empowerment through federating groups.
- Fight for Rights of disabled.
- Networking with others.

Activities:

- On 15.08.2011 Independence Day was celebrated in “Vaigarai Disabled” School.
- “World Disabled Day” was conducted in the KMSSS on 20.12.2011. Sports and Competitions and Rally were conducted for the participants. Most Rev. F. Antonisamy, Bishop of Kumbakonam Diocese, Vicar General, Thiruvidaimarudur Tahsildhar and Kumbakonam Union Chairman and VIPs participated and graced the occasion.

Beneficiaries:

- ✳ 36 persons were given I.D.
- ✳ 7 persons received tricycle.
- ✳ Rs.20,000/- was donated to one disabled, as marriage assistance.
- ✳ Sewing machine donated to 3 persons.
- ✳ Old age pension given to 237 persons.
- ✳ Two persons were given Motor-cycles.
- ✳ Through 2 Medical Camps, 182 persons benefitted with check up, guidance and referral advices.

Evaluation:

On 5th and 06th December, 2011, the CBR Forum, Bangalore assessed the performance of “Vaigarai Disabled Federation” of Thiruvudaimarudur and visited field area village Vanduvancheri and Thirunageswaram group.

3.0 EMPOWERING PROGRAMMES

3.1 Tamil Nadu State Voluntary Resource Centre (TNVRC)

TNVRC Target Area: Thanjavur, Thiruvarur, Pudukkottai, Nagapattinam, Perambalur and Ariyalur districts.

This scheme is being implemented in the KMSSS from November, 2010.

The objectives of the Project:

To empower the Panchayat level women federations through analysis and build their capacity in democratic process of development, leadership, social responsibilities and financial and managerial skills towards progressive State.

Trainers: KMSSS women group staff - 5 persons.

Trainees: Representatives of Panchayat level groups and federations of 5 districts.

Training Duration: 3 days.

Objectives:

- (1) Encourage the Self Help Group members (820 persons) and enhance their participation in village development and through 200 days work per annum and implement Government Schemes.
- (2) To establish Gender equity in men and women groups and remove gender based problems.

(3) To follow traditional farming methods and alternative sustainable measure among 450 SHG members and improve their life standard.

(4) To organize youth training with employment potentials.

VII. Activities:

- Violence against women meeting was held on 26.11.2011, in R.C. School Thiruvaiyaru. A total of 80 women participated in this meeting and special talk was given by Thiru A. Nalladurai, Advocate and KMSSS Secretary and Joint Secretary highlighted the role of women in critical situations of violence and unknown places.

Joint Secretary of KMSSS graced the occasion with his presence and blessings.
- A similar conference was held on Human Rights in Punalvasal on 18.02.2012. Advocate Mr. Subramaniam, Panchayat President Mr. Kanagaraj, and Rev. Sr. Jesi, Punalvasal Convent gave inspiring talks on the status of women and how to manage critical situations in the society. Seventy five women participated actively in the session.
- **Grama Sabha Meeting:**

Grama Sabha meeting was held on January 26th, 2012, in which 23 members from 18 villages represented the people and voiced their grievances such as the need

for their inclusion of below poverty level people, their list and registering their names in NREG Scheme and the importance of identity card; following this 20 persons were given I.D.

- From Anthoniyarpuram to Punalvasal, ½ km Tar road was laid which cost about Rs.75000/- through the efforts of women groups.

VIII. Economic Development:

The organization has given loan of Rs.1,50,000/- for economic development to the target people of Salethupuram, Anthoniyarpuram and Veersingampettai and the beneficiaries are engaged in agriculture development, 5 persons having their Milch Animal, 2 persons rearing goats and 5 persons have utilized their loan for their children study.

4.3 Milch Animal for Dalit Christians (Cow Project)

The Welfare schemes earmarked by the State Government as a measure of social development are not given to the Dalit people of Christianity and it is said that the Dalit Christian are listed in Backward Communities, which ultimately end in sufferings of Dalit Christian.

To overcome this practical problem, 'cow project' was introduced in the year 2004 and being continued for the deprived people of Dalit Christians with the eligibility criteria of widows, socially and economically backward, destitute are selected and assisted. Fifty persons benefited every year. From the year 2004, a total of 450 persons have benefited. This year a sum of Rs.601168/- is given to cow animal purchase.

Educational assistance (Scholarship) is provided to the school, college and technical and professional course students belonging to the Scheduled Caste/SC/B.C/ families, and encourage their participation and improve the standard of performance.

6.2 Jana Shree Bima Yojana (J.B.Y)

For benefiting the below poverty level people, this scheme was initiated in collaboration with L.I.C. India. The Jana Shree Bima Yojana Scheme was introduced in the year 2004, for KMSSS area people.

The LIC registered person has to pay Rs.100/- per year. An equal amount will be paid by the Central Government to the LIC. Validity period is one year for this amount. Every year the beneficiary should renew his policy and pay Rs.100/- as premium. Registration eligibility criteria for the beneficiary would be 18 years to 60 years of age.

In case, any accident occurs to the registered person and died, his nominee will get Rs.75000/-; for loss of any organ in accident Rs.50000/-; for inactivation of any part in the accident Rs.35000/-. For natural death, Rs.30000/- will be paid to the nominee of the deceased.

Under this scheme, if 100 persons take policies at a time as group insurance, their children who are studying in 9th, 10th, 11th, 12th Std and ITI will be awarded scholarship. Out of 100 policy holders, for 15 deserving policy holder children will be benefiting Rs.1200/- for each.

During the current year:

4579 persons registered under this scheme.

Benefits:

- Utilizing the stipulated benefit of group insurance scheme policy holders at the rate of Rs.1200/- per head, 331 children received total sum of Rs.397200/- as scholarship for education.
- For natural death of 12 policy holders Rs.360000/- paid to their nominees.
- Rs.75000/- was paid to the nominee of one policy holder who died in accident.
- Who opted for Group insurance scheme, 13 children were paid Rs.10000/- each for educational assistance.
